## In response to allegations made against Mr. Joris Demmink (former Secretary General of the Ministry of Security and Justice), the government of the Netherlands would like to provide the facts on this matter.

Charges against Mr. Demmink were thoroughly investigated by the Public Prosecution Service. The Public Prosecutor, an independent authority, determined the allegations against Mr. Demmink were unfounded.

The decision not to prosecute Mr. Demmink was upheld by the Court of Appeal.

Mr. Demmink was not in Turkey during the time the alleged charges occurred.

The Netherlands is a committed ally with the United States in the fight against human trafficking and will continue to be so. Our commitment is recognized by the State Department in its latest Trafficking in Persons report.
